

# Clarifying the Remaining Mission Task

 +  +  = 60% of the world population live in reached people groups.


 **Followers of Jesus**  
10% of world population.

 **Other Nominal Christians**  
23% of world population.

 +  = 33% of world population self-identify as "Christians"

 **Culturally-Near non-Believers**  
27% of world population.  
These non-believers can be reached by Christians who live in their own people groups. These groups are called *reached people groups*.

*40% of all the non-believers in the world are culturally near to believers and can be reached by them.*



 +  = 40% of the world population live in unreached people groups.

  **Culturally-Distant non-Believers**  
60% of all the non-believers in the world are culturally distant from believers. They live in unreached people groups (less than 2% Evangelical and less than 5% Nominal Christian), which still need missionaries from other cultures.

 **Culturally-Distant non-Believers in Frontier People Groups**  
*Frontier People Groups* (FPG), a subset of unreached people groups, have no indigenous movement to Christ, and less than 0.1% Christian. FPGs total 25% of the world population.

## Frontier Mission Challenge:

*Non-believers in Frontier People Groups have virtually no chance of hearing about Jesus from somebody in their own people group.*

**Mobilization Challenge:** For every 30 missionaries that go to the reached   people groups of the world ... roughly ONE missionary goes to the unreached   people groups, including the frontier  groups.

# 30 to 1

Perspective	Non-Frontier People Groups	Frontier People Groups (the neediest subset of Unreached People Groups)
Where Christians live	9,999 out of 10,000 (99.99%)	1 out of 10,000 (0.01%)
Christians to non-Christians	4,000 Christians for every 10,000 non-Christians	1 Christian for every 10,000 non-Christians
Where cross-cultural missionaries serve	Greater than 99%	Less than 1%
Cross-cultural missionaries to non-Christians	1 worker for every 8,500 non-Christians	1 worker for every 7,000,000 non-Christians
